

Jessica's piece of mind found in eye-catching mosaics

CAMBRIDGEWELL'S Jessica Cooke may be the youngest artist to have her work displayed at the Mosaic Association of Australia's bi-annual show.

The Year 7 Korowa Girls School student will head to Tasmania with her family next week for the event.

It will be her first trip interstate.

painting," Jessica, 13, said. Since then she has created mosaics with a mirror, tray, table and stepping stones.
